The Dealers' Choice Customer Service Awards offer ESTA's Dealer Members the opportunity to publicly recognize those vendors that provide consistently good customer service throughout the year and the Manufacturers' Choice Dealers of the Year Awards offer ESTA's Manufacturer Members the opportunity to publicly recognize those dealers that give superior performance in the areas of Staff, Sales and Marketing, Inventory and Financial Responsibility.

There is some important news concerning the ESTA Code of Conduct – previously only Members of the Association have been able to file complaints alleging violation of the Code of Conduct by another member. This system has been running successfully for a few years so the ESTA Board has concluded that it is time to take this the next step and open it to the general public. Accordingly, starting in January 2003, complaints may be submitted by anyone who feels they have cause. This change, which was planned from the beginning, shows the public that membership in ESTA is important and that an ESTA member company is a responsible company. In another related change, now that Paul Vincent has taken on the Chairmanship of the Technical Standards Committee he is standing down from his role of Chair of the Ethics Committee. Erik Magnuson will be taking over on Ethics and so will get to usher in this expansion. The Certification Program has reached an important crossroads in its development. It has taken some time to establish the internal procedures and to assemble the key personnel who will lead and serve on the individual working groups. Time enough has gone by that we need to ensure that the goals and intentions of the industry remain in support of a personnel certification program. In order to both build and gauge this support we felt it important to reach out beyond the small group of committed volunteers with an industry wide survey and confirm the level of interest in a program. The time is here to vote for Board Members and Officers for 2003 – you should have received your ballot papers in early October so please respond promptly before the November deadline. Your votes and support are critical for the democratic process. At this point I'd like to thank John Booth for his support of the Board over many years – after being 'Mr. Proxy' at many Board meetings and standing in for members who were unable to attend, John was elected in his own right in 2000. Unfortunately circumstances meant that John had to stand down from this position earlier this year. This was so close to the end of the three year term that we didn't appoint a

replacement – his position is vacant and will be filled by the normal elections at the end of this year.
